Strengthening Capabilities and Regional Reach, GMF Drives Strategic Partnerships in Asia Pacific

Singapore, September 25th 2026 — PT Garuda Maintenance Facility Aero Asia Tbk (GMF), part of the Garuda Indonesia Group, is strengthening its maintenance, repair, and overhaul (MRO) business and services across the Asia Pacific region through a series of strategic partnerships and new aircraft maintenance projects announced at MRO Asia-Pacific 2026, held at Singapore EXPO on (09/23-24).

Strategic Partnerships

During the event, GMF strengthened a number of strategic partnerships with key players across the aviation industry.

Together with FTAI Aviation Ltd. (FTAI), a U.S.-based company specializing in aircraft engine, GMF is establishing a long-term partnership to develop engine and APU maintenance business opportunities across the Asia Pacific region. The initial scope covers CFM56-5B and CFM56-7B engines, as well as GTCP131-9 series APUs, with capacity allocation secured for FTAI over the next five years.

GMF also signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with PT VELA Prima Nusantara, an Indonesian manufacturing and Advanced Air Mobility (AAM) development company, to explore GMF's potential role as an MRO Approved Facility for Vela Alpha. The advanced air mobility aircraft utilizes electric Vertical Take-Off and Landing (eVTOL) and hybrid Vertical Take-Off and Landing (hVTOL) technologies. The collaboration will explore facility readiness, technical capabilities, as well as development and certification support.

With, AerOne Techniques Pte Ltd, a company specializing in the management and distribution of aircraft and engine components, including used serviceable material, repair management, and Parts Manufacturer Approval (PMA), GMF is exploring opportunities to develop PMA capabilities. The initiative forms part of GMF's efforts to expand aircraft component development and production, potentially providing airlines and operators with broader parts options tailored to market needs.

Meanwhile, GMF is strengthening its trading material collaboration with PDQ AeroSpares, an aerospace consumables provider serving the MRO industry. The partnership is expected to

support more efficient utilization of aircraft materials while expanding GMF's aftermarket services and business network.

Strengthening Maintenance Projects

In addition to expanding its strategic partnerships, GMF also reaffirmed a number of aircraft maintenance projects with customers across the Asia Pacific region, including:

- Thai VietJet for Airbus A320 maintenance projects.
- Cebu Pacific for maintenance of 43 Airbus A320 and A330 aircraft during 2027-2028, as well as ATR aircraft maintenance projects.
- AirZeta for Boeing B747-400 maintenance projects from 2027-2030.
- Air Navigator for ATR aircraft maintenance projects during 2026-2027.
- Japan Airlines for Line Maintenance and Ground Handling services in Soekarno-Hatta International Airport, Cengkareng.

"The partnerships and projects we secured at MRO Asia-Pacific reflect the trust that customers and partners place in GMF's capabilities, while also opening up broader opportunities for business growth," said GMF CEO, Andi Fahrurrozi.

The momentum was further strengthened through meetings with a number of airlines and aviation industry players, including GE Aerospace, Aero Dili, Lufthansa Shenzhen, PNG Air, Lao Airlines, Jetstar, K-Mile, All Nippon Airways, Thai Airways, Trinity Airways, Sun PhuQuoc, and Thai AirAsia Berhad. Discussions focused on potential collaborations and new projects across various service areas, including Airframe, Engine, Component, Line Maintenance, Cabin Services, and Engineering Services.

GMF's participation in MRO Asia-Pacific 2026 is part of the Company's efforts to drive revenue growth by optimizing facility and workforce utilization, expanding its customer base, and responding to the evolving demand for MRO services across the Asia Pacific region.

"We see Asia Pacific as a growing market, and we aim to grow alongside its evolving needs. With more than 75 years of experience in the MRO industry and an established track record of serving customers across the Asia Pacific region, GMF has a strong foundation to further develop its capabilities and expand its partnerships. Moving forward, we will continue strengthening GMF's role as a regional MRO partner capable of delivering integrated, competitive, flexible, and relevant solutions for customers across the region," Andi concluded.
